

T.C.V.A. Summer Camp Code of Conduct

2026

1. Attendance and Participation

Entry and exit times must be respected unless there is a justified reason for arriving late or leaving early. Because the camp includes many group activities, punctuality is essential for smooth operation. Participation in all scheduled activities is required to ensure an interactive and enjoyable experience for everyone.

2. Appropriate Clothing

All children enrolled in the summer camp must attend wearing appropriate clothing and footwear for the planned activities. If camp staff determine that a child's attire is not suitable, they may contact the family to provide the correct clothing. If necessary, the child may be sent home to avoid safety or liability issues. Appropriate attire includes:

- A T-shirt
- Long or short athletic pants
- Sports shoes with laces

3. Hygiene Requirements

Children must attend camp with basic hygiene standards similar to those required at school. If staff determine that a child's hygiene is inadequate, they may contact the family to address the situation. If necessary, the child may be sent home to avoid health or safety concerns.

4. Behavior and Respect

Children must follow essential behavior guidelines to ensure a positive environment and respectful coexistence with peers and staff. They must follow all instructions given by camp monitors to maintain a safe and enjoyable atmosphere. The following behaviors will **not** be tolerated:

- Physical or verbal violence
- Bullying or harassment
- Heavy or inappropriate jokes
- Threats

- Any form of discrimination (race, religion, ideology, etc.)

If a child violates these rules, staff will notify the family. If the behavior continues on subsequent days, the child may be suspended from camp for 1 to 3 days. If the behavior persists after returning, the child may be expelled from the camp.

5. Care of Facilities and Conduct Expectations

Children must take care of the facilities provided by the school for camp use. Additional expectations include:

- Parents may not interfere with camp activities.
- Children must respect the monitors and their decisions at all times.
- Children are expected to remain coachable and open to guidance.

6. Refund Policy

Camp fees will not be refunded under any circumstances, except in cases of serious illness supported by medical documentation.

7. Prohibited Items

Children may not bring weapons, dangerous objects, or animals. Because most of the day is spent in sports and group activities, the use of smartphones or computers is prohibited during activities. This is an important rule designed to help children disconnect from screens and fully engage in the summer camp experience. Designated times for device use may be provided.
